

You may have heard that pet adoptions have been very strong during the Pandemic with so many spending more time at home. Thankfully, given the high number of abandoned cats we are rescuing from the streets these days, AFL has found that to be true for us locally. So how does it work? Clearly, we have had to make some adjustments to our usual protocols without compromising standards or omitting any crucial qualifying factors for potential adopters.


ADOPTIONS IN THE AGE OF COVID

Our application process for both fosters and adopters has always included an in-person home visit to ensure the comfort and safety of both pets and people. The home visit is still happening; what has changed is that now it is virtual. After an application is reviewed and references checked, a short video tour of the home is submitted. This allows us to see where the pet will live, eat, sleep, and also see entry doors to ensure a secure environment.

Normally, the last step before adoption is a meet-and-greet in the foster home, to give the adopter an opportunity to visit and get to know the pet in familiar surroundings. In this time of social distancing, we do not ask this of our foster families or adopters. Instead, once the adopter has had an opportunity to learn about the pet and perhaps chat directly with the foster parent, once approved, a volunteer delivers the pet in a safe, contact-free manner. Paperwork is exchanged at that time, and the adopter signs a 30-day foster-to-adopt agreement to give both humans and pets a chance to meet and bond. At the end of that period if all is well, the adoption contract is signed and adoption fee paid. AFL takes pride in matching adopters with just the right cat for them. We are happy to say that so far, this system is working like a charm.

We are most grateful to our adopters and (always desperately needed) foster families for working with us to make successful adoptions happen during this trying time for everyone.





We are always in desperate need of foster homes. There are even more animals who find themselves outside just waiting for a safe place to land. A spare room and your tender, loving care are all that is required to foster a homeless animal until a forever home can be found.
